

On August 6, 2020, City Manager Erik Walsh presented the City of San Antonio's FY 2021 Proposed Budget to the Mayor and City Council. We are pleased to share that despite the unprecedented impact that the COVID-19 pandemic has had on the City's revenue, the proposed budget includes an ad hoc COLA and no increases for dental or vision insurance for all retirees. For pre-65 retirees, the proposed budget calls for no change in plans offered or premiums charged for coverage. Post-65 retirees will see lower premiums for the Medicare Advantage Standard PPO and Pharmacy-Only coverage, which closely matches your current coverage. An Enhanced PPO plan with additional covered benefits and low out-of-pocket costs will be introduced with higher monthly premiums. The City of San Antonio is grateful for your dedicated service and remains committed to providing you with a comprehensive package of affordable health care benefits and a secure retirement income.

### **All Retirees**

**Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA)**—The FY 2021 Proposed Budget includes an ad hoc cost of living adjustment for City retirees, which means a **1.6% increase in your monthly TMRS annuity check beginning in January 2021.** 

**Dental & Vision Health Benefits**—Dental and vision benefits will continue to be offered in 2021 through Delta Dental and Davis Vision, respectively, **with no changes in premiums**. Retirees will still have the option of selecting between the **CitiDent PPO and Delta Care Dental HMO plans** for dental coverage.

#### **Aetna Medicare Retiree Health Plans**

After a competitive bid process, Aetna was selected to continue administering Medicare Advantage plans for post -65 retirees. Three plans will continue to be offered in 2021—the Medicare Advantage Standard PPO, a new Medicare Advantage Enhanced PPO, and the Pharmacy-Only plan. The Medicare Advantage Standard PPO plan is the same as the current Medicare Advantage PPO plan, but will feature significantly reduced monthly premiums. The new Medicare Advantage Enhanced PPO plan includes a higher monthly premium, but the only out-of-pocket costs will be for prescriptions; this plan includes zero co-pays for medical visits. Both PPO plans will feature enhancements, such as a meal program, health rewards, transportation (40 one-way trips annually), Silver Sneakers, and a \$500 hearing aid benefit every 36 months. Proposed monthly premiums can be found on the back page.

### **Non-Medicare Retiree Health Plans**

Under the FY 2021 Proposed Budget, non-Medicare retirees will continue to have three plan options available—Consumer Choice, New Value, and Blue Essentials HMO.

All three plans provide coverage for the same services you use today (ex: doctor's office visits, preventive care, prescription medications, etc.). Plan features, such as Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA)—intense therapy treatment for autism spectrum disorder; Consumer Medical—provides expert medical opinion, advocacy and treatment options; and Travel & Lodging—reimbursement benefit for those traveling for approved medical treatment, will continue to be offered as well. Proposed monthly premiums can be found on the back page.

#### **Annual Enrollment**

2021 Retiree Annual Enrollment will take place in October. This is your chance to change your medical plan for the 2021 plan year. More information, including your specific enrollment dates, to come in the next issue of *Retiree Matters*. In the coming weeks, Medicare-eligible retirees will receive information directly from Aetna, and non-Medicare retirees will receive information from the City.

Due to COVID-19, the City will not host in-person Annual Enrollment sessions this year. Instead, we will host a virtual WebEx session during Annual Enrollment to help answer your questions.
