duced new rates for City retirees: Join Fee: \$15 enrollment; Adult: \$25; and Family (2 adults and children up to age 26): \$60.

Membership benefits include group exercise classes; wellness orientation; child care while you workout (with Family membership); preferred pricing and priority registration for Youth Programs; family programming and special events; and access to participating YMCA locations across the country while traveling. Additionally, all members can also take advantage of YMCA360, the Y's virtual option, offering 1,500+ on-demand and live classes online.

For Medicare retirees, be sure to explore Aetna's Silver Sneakers program as it might be a better value for you to enroll in the YMCA through that program instead.

Happy New Year to all and a special welcome to the 108 retirees who joined RECOSA in 2022! Last year was a busy one with RECOSA undertaking a survey of members and following up on topics of interest to retirees during our Brown Bag/Annual Meeting held On November 18, 2022. The City's Human Resources Department found an ideal venue for the combined Brown Bag/Annual Meeting at Pre-K 4 SA East. There was plenty of parking, easy access, and lots of room to spread out and visit. Members met in small groups to help prioritize suggestions for future Brown Bag topics and quality of life activities that were submitted through the 2022 RECOSA survey. The survey and small group feedback will provide direction for the RECOSA Board in 2023 and for years to come. We appreciate the individuals and businesses who contributed the 30 door prizes given away at the meeting. We also want to thank Generations Federal Credit Union for their continued generous financial contribution that provided box lunches for the event, as well as funds for technology support.

During the Annual Meeting, board elections were held. The Nominating Committee recommended a slate of candidates of three incumbents (Diana Alcocer, Martha Sepeda, & Michael Trainer) and three new candidates (Lewis Andrews, Nora Chavez, & Sal Garza). There were no nominations from the floor and the slate was unanimously approved by the members in attendance. Subsequently, Nora Chavez resigned from the board, so there is still a vacancy to fill on the board. We are looking for fellow retirees who want to help build our organization. A detailed 2022 Annual Report has been prepared and is available for review on recosa.org. The report includes: 1) results from the survey, as well as feedback from the November Brown Bag attendees, 2) RECOSA's coordination with Human Resources and the City Manager's Office regarding health insurance premiums and other benefit issues, 3) RECOSA's online communication enhancements, and 4) RECOSA's financial report for 2022.

the survey and small group discussions. Our next Brown Bag session will be on March 24 and will include an important Healthy Heart presentation, as well as some "social time," so we can visit with fellow retirees and catch up on the latest news.
