Words on RECOSA—A Note From the Chair

Happy Summer, everyone!

Thank you to those retirees who were able to join us for the **March 24, 2023, Brown Bag session**. We enjoyed excellent presentations from the Methodist Hospital System and the American Heart Association on preventing heart disease, as well as blood pressure checks and a demonstration of hands-only CPR. Please visit the recosa.org website under Presentations and Reports to view the presentations that were shared during the March 24 session.

As summer approaches, it's time to get moving! The benefit of staying active is the focus of our **June 16th Brown Bag session**. Our speaker will be Dr. Monica Serra, PhD, Associate Professor at UT Health's Barshop Institute for Longevity and Aging. Dr. Serra will share why being physically active is so important, especially during one's senior years. We will also host representatives from AARP and AACOG at tables to inform attendees on resources available through their organizations. Our 2022 RECOSA Survey revealed areas of concern for retirees such as: Social Security issues and assistance, Medicare fraud and scams, legal resources, long term care, transportation for medical appointments, and other related topics. Both organizations provide a variety of programs and services related to the needs of retirees. If they don't have the answers for you, they will know where to direct you.

On March 4, 2023, RECOSA representatives participated in the City's Retirement Education Workshop for active employees. RECOSA had the opportunity to introduce employees to RECOSA and to encourage them to join us when they retire. In addition, RECOSA will have a board representative on the evaluation panel for the review of proposals for pre-65 retiree/active employee health insurance and prescription coverage in FY 2024.

RECOSA BOARD VACANCY: We are also looking for another retiree to fill a vacant seat on our RECOSA Board. We meet the first Tuesday of every month via video conference. Health & Safety



Did you know that both Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Texas (BCBSTX) and Aetna offer their members a travel/transportation benefit? See below for the specific details.

Pre-65 Retirees enrolled in BCBSTX

This travel and lodging benefit provides reimbursement for those traveling to receive treatment for a transplant or inpatient/

outpatient cancer treatments.

- The travel distance requirement for reimbursement is 100 miles. Eligible expenses should be compliant with IRS guidelines and are subject to a \$10,000 lifetime maximum.
- Benefits are paid at a per diem (per day) rate of \$50 per person per night. Individuals can include a person traveling with them.
- To be reimbursed, you will need to submit a qualifying receipt.
- Examples of travel expenses include: airfare at coach rate, taxi, ground transportation, and mileage reimbursement at the IRS rate for the most direct route between the patient's home and the designated provider.
- Prior authorization is not required for the travel, but would be required for any covered treatments.

Post-65 Retirees enrolled in Aetna

This transportation benefit provides rides to and from non-emergency medical appointments.

- You can schedule rides for any covered medical appointments such as visits with your primary care provider, dialysis, behavioral health, preventive services, vaccine appointments, chemotherapy, physical therapy, and dental visits.
- Trips must be scheduled at least 48 hours in advance, but can be scheduled up to 30 days in advance.
- You can have an escort (family member or caregiver) ride with you.
- Professional drivers will bring you comfortably and safely to your destination.
- You are responsible for being ready when the driver arrives. Drivers are not responsible for assisting you from home door to vehicle or vehicle to office.
- Rides are provided through Access2CareSM.
- The number of trips and miles per trip depends on your plan. If you need a ride to and from the doctor, you'll use two trips.
- To schedule a ride, call 1-855-814-1699, Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
